VISION

The overall vision of SSEM is to empower the people of South Sudan and to increase their ability to be self-sufficient, independent, and productive citizens of the new nation of the Republic of South Sudan.

The core of our mission is to educate men, women, and children who cannot read and write due to the ongoing civil war that began with the independence of Sudan in 1956. In educating people in their own communities, we empower them to solve problems and assimilate into the culture and community that is governed by the rule of law. In this way, SSEM will support the effort to rebuild the Republic of South Sudan and enable people to live peacefully in their villages.

COMPLETED PROJECT: CHURCH BUILDING!

In the summer of 2013, Paul returned to South Sudan to oversee the building of a church in Pinythor.

Funds for the building project came from a generous donations from GracePoint Presbyterian Church. The materials were purchased in Ethiopia and transported to South Sudan where the entire community came together to build this house of God.
